SERMON TITLE: How to Make Your Faith Real

SCRIPTURE: James 2:14-26

- [14] What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them?
- [15] Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food.
- [16] If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it?
- [17] In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead.
- [18] But someone will say, "You have faith; I have deeds." Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds.
- [19] You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that—and shudder.
- [20] You foolish person, do you want evidence that faith without deeds is useless?
- [21] Was not our father Abraham considered righteous for what he did when he offered his son Isaac on the altar?
- [22] You see that his faith and his actions were working together, and his faith was made complete by what he did.
- [23] And the scripture was fulfilled that says, "Abraham believed God, and it was credited to him as righteousness," and he was called God's friend.
- [24] You see that a person is considered righteous by what they do and not by faith alone.
- [25] In the same way, was not even Rahab the prostitute considered righteous for what she did when she gave lodging to the spies and sent them off in a different direction?
- [26] As the body without the spirit is dead, so faith without deeds is dead.

Title: How to Make Your Faith Real

Matthew 5:16 In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

1. Your works make worship, belief, and trust <u>real</u> and <u>tangible</u>.

- James emphasizes faith and works not works instead of faith.
- Our works are like salt and light.

2. Your works witness to your neighbors.

• Your neighbors can't see your <u>faith</u>, they can only see your <u>works</u>.

3. Your works magnify God.

4. Your works show that Christ is alive and working in our world.

- Faith without works exists among <u>demons</u> but not among <u>Christians</u>.
- This proves the <u>fallacy</u> of "it doesn't matter <u>what</u> you believe as long as you believe <u>something</u>".

Lagniappe
